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Question - 1:

Why do you believe we should hire you as Nail Technician?

Ans:

This question needs to be carefully answered as it is your opportunity to stick out from the rest of the applicants. You should focus on skills that you have, including those not yet mentioned. Simply responding "because I'm really good" or "I really need a job" isn't going to work. You shouldn't assume the skills of other applicants or their strengths, focus on yourself. Tell the interviewer why you are a good fit for the position, what makes you a good employee, and what you can provide the company. Keep it brief while highlighting achievements.

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Question - 2:

Explain what projects can I contribute to right away?

Ans:

One of the most frustrating things about hiring someone new is that it can take forever to get them trained and up to speed. When a candidate asks a question like this, he lets the interviewers know that he will find a way to help as soon as possible, which is a major bonus. This again gives you the opportunity to sell yourself as someone who can help on those projects, and as an added bonus-it lets you know what skills you need to brush up on before your next interview or even before starting the job.

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Question - 3:

What knowledge do you have about the company and our work?

Ans:

You should do your research prior to the interview. Look into background history of the company, this will help you stick out. Learn about main people, have they been in the news lately? The interviewer doesn't expect you to know dates and certain people, but showing that you have enough interest to research the company is a positive impression.

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Question - 4:

I read in X that Y is happening. How will this affect your business?

Ans:

Read everything you can about the company you're joining and see what their competitors are doing, It will mark you out from other candidates and show understanding.

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Question - 5:

Tell me what experience do you have in this field for nail technician position?

Ans:

- * Speak about specifics that relate to the position you are applying for. If you do not have specific experience, get as close as you can.
- * If you are being asked this question from your employer then you can explain your experience. Tell the employer what responsibilities you were performing during your job. You can tell what programs you developed and what modules you worked on. What were your achievements regarding different programs.

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Question - 6:

Can you please tell me how your organization defines success?

Ans:

It would be wise to save this question for the interviewing manager, and not for a peer/technical discussion. Nobody likes a kiss-up, but letting management know



that you will communicate openly and honestly with them, always scores big points. The last part of the question can be a good barometer about how easy it will be to become a top performer. You can follow up with a discussion of how you have been successful in your previous jobs.

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Question - 7:

What do you consider to be your best weakness as Nail Technician?

Ans:

This can be a tricky question to respond to, if you suggest you have no weaknesses you're going to appear as a lair or egotistical. You should respond realistically by mentioning small work related weaknesses. Although many try to answer using a positive skill in disguise as a weakness, like "I expect co-workers to have the same commitment" or "I am a perfectionist". However, it is recommended that there is some honesty and the weaknesses are true, and then emphasize on how you have overcome it or working to improve it. The purpose of this question is to see how you view and evaluate yourself.

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Question - 8:

What would success look like to you in three months?

Ans:

This will help you to understand their expectations, but also shows that you are objective-driven

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Question - 9:

Tell me about your ability to work under pressure as Nail Technician?

Ans:

You may say that you thrive under certain types of pressure. Give an example that relates to the type of position applied for.

Mention pressures you face on the daily, such as dealing with deadlines on a regular basis.

Try not to use an example where you created the pressure yourself, by waiting too long to start something, or by handling a task irresponsibly at the beginning. For example, working under pressure to meet a customer's deadline could be a good example, but not if you had waited too long to start the project.

"Pressure is actually a catalyst to my work. When there is an imperative deadline, I refocus my energy into my work which in fact, has helped me to produce some of my best works. (Give examples) I guess you can say I thrive under pressure."

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Question - 10:

what have you done to improve your knowledge for nail technician position in the last year?

Ans:

- * Try to include improvement activities that relate to the job. A wide variety of activities can be mentioned as positive self-improvement. Have some good ones handy to mention.
- * Employers look for applicants who are goal-oriented. Show a desire for continuous learning by listing hobbies non-work related. Regardless of what hobbies you choose to showcase, remember that the goal is to prove self-sufficiency, time management, and motivation.
- * Everyone should learn from his mistake. I always try to consult my mistakes with my kith and kin especially with elderly and experienced person.
- * I enrolled myself into a course useful for the next version of our current project. I attended seminars on personal development and managerial skills improvement.

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Question - 11:

Tell me what is the immediate need on your team that you are hoping to fill with this position?

Ans:

This is probably my favorite question. You know that their team has a need, because they have an opening. There is most likely a project about to get started, or a required skill-set that they need but are lacking. Whatever they come back with, this is a perfect segue for you to explain why you are the perfect person to fill that gap. You can explain why your experience and expertise makes you exactly who they have been looking for.

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Question - 12:

Basic Nail technicians interview questions:

Ans:

- * What kinds of situations do you find most stressful?
- * Describe a situation where you had to plan or organise something.
- * Example when you went above and beyond the call of duty.
- * How long would you stay with our company?
- * Do you have any questions for me?

Try to avoid specific classifications, whatever it may be.

The best way to find out is to ask them now--or pose the question on Facebook and let everyone chime in. Choose replies that would work well in a job setting, such as "dependable" or "trustworthy." As a bonus, you get a peek into what the people around you really see as your best side.

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Question - 24:

What do you see yourself doing in five years as Nail Technician?

Ans:

This is another question looking towards job commitment. Some people go through jobs like socks because they don't have a life plan, and your answer can show insight into this. It can also be used for finding out if you are the type that sets goals at all in life, because those that make long-term goals are usually more reliable. Also, your goals can provide insight on your personality too.

You should respond with an answer that shows progression in your career is on track with your route in the company. It's important to do your research on company prospects, this way you understand what to expect and if it's in your long-term goal. Interviewers don't want to set you on a path that won't provide the results you want, resulting in you resigning.

Question - 25:

Explain is this team empowered to find better and more efficient ways to do things?

The interview process is all about differentiation, and a question like this shows the interviewers that you are determined to be a rock star. Most companies have many folks who are perfectly happy to learn how to do the basic tasks of their job, and then sit back and collect a paycheck. What they are looking for is someone

who is driven to make things better, who won't just be satisfied with the status quo. By not only identifying yourself as a big time horse, but making sure that the company will give room to graze, you are guaranteed to stand out.

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Question - 26:

What's up with these gaps in your employment history?

This isn't the red flag it used to be, since the Great Recession isn't that far behind us, but it's still relevant. How you answer depends on the reality of your situation. Were you laid off with scores of others? Did you have trouble finding a job or take a few random gigs to make ends meet? There's no shame in that, so be honest.

Question - 27:

What skills/qualities are needed to succeed in this role? What sort of candidates do you find thrive in this environment?

Ans:

These questions indicate you've been paying careful attention, Everyone appreciates being listened to. If there's an area where you feel you've excelled that your interviewer hasn't addressed then your choice of question can be used to direct the conversation. For example, you could ask whether a specific characteristic or skill is important for the role? If the interviewer responds positively you've just created an opening to explain your qualifications and experience in that area in more detail.

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Question - 28:

What's your biggest strength/weakness as Nail Technician?

This pair is played out, but it still gets asked on a regular basis. Interviewers know all the cop-out answers (like being "too much of an achiever"), and a lot of managers tune out during these questions anyway. The trick? Answer them honestly, but choose your mildest weakness and a moderate strength. Saying you prefer prioritizing to multitasking is a good "weakness" since recent studies show that nobody excels at multitasking.

A dream job can quickly turn into a nightmare if you dislike those you're working with or if you don't fit into the company culture.

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Question - 30:

Explain where do you want to be career-wise in five years?

Ans:

This one's tricky and depends on the job you're applying for. However, assuming it's a job you plan to stick with for a few years, it's time to do your research. American society has a penchant for assuming everyone wants to keep climbing the corporate ladder when that might not be the case. Not everyone wants to be a manager or to have "senior" in front of his or her title. If you do want to keep moving up the ranks, figure out the next ladder rung at the company you're interviewing with and work that goal into the answer.

Question - 31:

Question - 34:



What are your salary expectations as Nail Technician?

This question is like a loaded gun, tricky and dangerous if you're not sure what you are doing. It's not uncommon for people to end up talking salary before really selling their skills, but knowledge is power as this is a negotiation after all. Again, this is an area where doing your research will be helpful as you will have an understanding of average salary.

One approach is asking the interviewer about the salary range, but to avoid the question entirely, you can respond that money isn't a key factor and you're goal is to advance in your career. However, if you have a minimum figure in mind and you believe you're able to get it, you may find it worth trying.

Question - 35:

Why are you leaving last job as Nail Technician?

Although this would seem like a simple question, it can easily become tricky. You shouldn't mention salary being a factor at this point. If you're currently employed, your response can focus on developing and expanding your career and even yourself. If you're current employer is downsizing, remain positive and brief. If your employer fired you, prepare a solid reason. Under no circumstance should you discuss any drama or negativity, always remain positive.
