Basic Museum Interpreter Job Interview Questions:

- * Share an experience you had in dealing with a difficult person and how you handled the situation.
- * Share an effective method you have used to describe points of interest to groups.
- * What is the key to success when communicating with the public.
- * Share an example of when you went above and beyond the "call of duty". (Look for answers that show the candidate is dependable.)
- * Name a time when your patience was tested. How did you keep your emotions in check?
- * How do you balance cooperation with others and independent thinking? Share an example. (Try to determine if the candidate has a cooperative attitude or is otherwise good-natured.)
- * Provide an example when your ethics were tested.
- * Provide a time when you worked in a rapidly evolving workplace. How did you deal with the change? (Make sure the candidate is flexible.)
- * Provide a time when you dealt calmly and effectively with a high-stress situation.
- * Share an example of a time you had to gather information from multiple sources. How did you determine which information was relevant?
- * Provide an experience in which you were sensitive to someone's needs or feelings. How did your helpfulness affect your work environment?
- * Share an experience in which you successfully shared a difficult piece of information. (Make sure that the candidate has open lines of communication.)
- * Please share an experience in which you presented to a group. What was the situation and how did it go?
- * Share an experience in which your attention to detail and thoroughness had an impact on your last company.
- * Share an experience in which personal connections to coworkers or others helped you to be successful in your work. (Make sure candidate works well with others.)

Question - 20:

You have 8 jars of the same size and shape. Seven of the jars weigh 5 ounces while the eighth jar weighs 6. You have a scale you can use to measure the jars but you can only measure twice. How do you find out which is the heavier jar?

Ans:

You take two jars away. Put 3 jars on one side of the scale and 3 jars on the other side. Measure. If neither of them are heavier, the jar must have been in one of the two you took away. Measure and you will find the jar. If one of the scales did tilt, take 1 jar away of the remaining 3 and measure the two remaining jars on each side of the scale. If one tilts, that is the heavier jar. If neither tilts, the one remaining jar must be the heavy one.

Question - 21:

A snail is at the bottom of a 30 foot well. Every hour the snail is able to climb up 3 feet, then immediately slide back down 2 feet. How many hours does it take for the snail to get out of the well?

Ans:

28 hours. The snail is travelling at one foot per hour, except on the 28th hour the snail has already reached the top of the well, so it will not slide down the 2 feet.

Tell me do you have any experience handling money?

Ans:

All of our interpreters may, at some point, be involved with selling tickets or items in the gift shop. Working as a cashier at a supermarket or a waiter or waitress clearly shows that they can handle money, but people will leave those jobs off their resumes. They're thinking that those jobs are going to detract from their history work, but I'm looking for experience handling money, so when I see those types of jobs, that boosts their chances. They definitely should leave them on. . . . Being a cashier at a supermarket is great experience. You can deal with money and pressure, and you had to be nice to every person that went through your line, even if they weren't.
