For the transportation industry, important strengths include communication (since you'll need to effectively relay information from a distance) and ability to learn new things (especially technology advancements).

If you have any interest in a dedicated run in the future, find out how many dedicated runs the company has available and how they are awarded to interested drivers.

Following the question above, ask how long you need to work before you are eligible for benefits.

Tell us have you ever missed a deadline? Why and how did you handle it?

Ans:

Shows willingness to follow procedure.

Explain me how is performance/progress assessed?

Ans:

Companies should have specific standards that they use to evaluate drivers.

Tell me is pay based on a per-mile rate or an hourly rate?

Ans:

There are benefits to both pay models, and you need to be fully informed either way.

Tell me what is your availability for this position?

Ans:

I am willing to start right away.

Suppose if you pay by the mile, is mileage calculated by hub miles, dispatched miles, loaded miles, or a computer program?

Each company calculates mileage in a different way. Ask this question ahead of time so you aren't unpleasantly surprised when you begin driving.

Explain how you've handled a breakdown or setback?

Ans:

Tests response under stress.

Explain me does traffic congestion stress you out? How do you handle it?

Ans:

Your reply to this question should always be a no. As a truck driver, it's your responsibility to remain calm and collected behind the wheel. Interviewers want to hear that you can handle traffic congestion with ease. Be sure to mention what cities you have driven in and what type of traffic to which you are accustomed.

Note: If you are a newer driver, it is okay to be a little uneasy about driving in bigger cities with a lot of traffic. The interviewer will likely provide you with a few extra ride alongs to ensure you are comfortable before being sent out alone. Rather than stating your are uneasy or stressed out in these situations, you can let them know you are less experienced in this area and would appreciate additional training.

CDL is short for Commercial Drivers' License. There are many different classes of CDL including Class A, B, and C. In addition to these; you can add a multitude of endorsements including:

- * H Endorsement: for transporting hazardous materials.
- * N Endorsement: for operating tank vehicles.
- * P Endorsement: for operating a truck with a specified number of passengers.
- * S Endorsement: for operating a school bus.
- * T Endorsement: for towing a double or triple trailer.
- * X Endorsement: for operating a combination of HAZMAT and tank vehicles.
