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Dialysis Therapist Interview Questions And Answers Guide.

Question - 1:

Please explain are You A Self Motivator As A Nurse?

Ans:

Absolutely, I can always find something productive that needs doing. I am very motivated to do a good job at what I take on and I like to stay busy. I am a self motivator and I take great pride in my job as a nurse.

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Question - 2:

Tell us how do you see yourself?

Ans:

The best way to answer this question again is, to be honest. Asses yourself and talk about yourself in length. Do not be overconfident as it will break the deal. Be confident and talk about your skills, relationships with the people at work and performance.

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Question - 3:

Tell us as a student, how were you?

Ans:

Be honest while answering this question, because you will have to provide them with the mark sheets and the mark sheets will give away the truth. Talk about the subjects that you loved during your school days. Tell them about the subjects you found difficult and tell them the reasons too.

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Question - 4:

Tell me how Do You Handle Stress As A Nurse?

Ans:

Stress is very important to me. With stress, I do the best possible job. The appropriate way to deal with stress is to make sure I have the correct balance between good stress and bad stress. I need good stress to stay motivated and productive. I react to situations, rather than to stress. That way, the situation is handled and doesn't become stressful.

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Question - 5:

Tell me would You Become A Doctor If You Had The Opportunity As Nurse?

Ans:

No, I enjoy the personal contact with my patients and the comradeship with my colleagues unique to nursing. I chose to become a nurse because I find the field fascinating. I plan on advancing my career as a nurse, not a doctor.

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Question - 6:

Explain how Do You Handle Failure As A Nurse?

Ans:

Recruiters will also want to determine if you have the confidence to admit your failings and learn from your mistakes. In addition, this type of question is another device for uncovering your weaknesses to determine whether you have the right stuff to get the job done.

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Question - 7:

Tell us what do your co-workers tell about you?

**Ans:**

To answer this question, make sure that you are positive. Talk about the compliments you get from your employers and from your co-workers. Tell them how your co-workers feel about you. For example, 'My co-workers tell me that I am very hardworking and that I communicate well with the patients.' Give more such instances and you will be good to go.

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Question - 8:

Tell us can we refer to your previous employer or current employer?

Ans:

Do not hesitate to answer this question, agree to it instantly. If you hesitate then the interviewer will think that you have something to hide, they will think that you have a bad reputation in the previous workplace. So, don't let them think this and see to it that you agree to the question immediately. If you are currently working, then tell them that refer to the hospital once you get the job.

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Question - 9:

Tell me what do you expect from this job?

Ans:

While answering this question, you will have to be realistic. Don't talk about high expectations instead be reasonable. Research about the company and then set your expectations. Talk about the career growth that you expect after joining this hospital.

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Question - 10:

Explain me your previous job/ current job?

Ans:

Stick to the facts, while you answer this question. Talk about your day to day work and how you handle the projects. Do not complain about your workplace. Talk about the values you provided your previous employers with. Do not boast about the work you do. Just stick to the facts and you will do just fine.

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Question - 11:

Can you tell me what Do You Find Most Rewarding About Being A Nurse?

Ans:

- * The most rewarding thing for me as a nurse is seeing the joy when a family first holds their baby.
- * Interacting with the patients and their families is what I find most rewarding.
- * I find helping patients through recovery after surgery, which is often one of their greatest challenges, to be most rewarding.

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Question - 12:

Tell me how do you ensure that operational safety standards are adhered to?

Ans:

Candidates should acknowledge the significance of safety and cleanliness in their job. They should adopt a formulaic approach to ensuring safety standards are met, which includes the sterilization of operating equipment before use.

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Question - 13:

Please tell me do You Work Well With Other People In Nursing?

Ans:

Companies want to know how you work well with other people and you will need to say more than you enjoy working with others, which is the standard response.

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Question - 14:

Please explain why do you want to be a nurse in our hospital?

Ans:

In order to answer this question, you will have to do some research about the hospital. Understand the mission and vision of the hospital and then think about your answer. Emphasize your strengths that will be useful for the hospital. Make your answer suitable to the conditions in the hospital. Say for example you can answer by saying 'I have always wanted to work in the pediatric department and your hospital's pediatric department is one of the best in the state.' Your answer can vary depending on the hospital you are being interviewed for. Understand the culture of the hospital and carve your answer accordingly.

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Question - 15:

Please explain what are your hobbies and interests?

Ans:

Talk about your hobbies and interests that you were associated with while you were in school and college. If you were good at sports, then talk about it in details, if you were into poetry, writing or painting talk about it too. Back up your answer by showing the certificates that you have received (if you have any). If you are good at sports, it means that you are a team player. If you are good at writing poetry, or if you are into painting it mostly means that you have a creative streak. So, don't



worry and simply talk about the activities that you engage in as hobbies.

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Question - 16:

Explain me if you are criticized, how do you respond to the criticism?

Ans:

It is clear that we all hate criticism of all kinds, however, you cannot say this to your interviewer. You will have to be positive while answering this question. Be honest and tell them that although criticism hurts, it helps in making us better eventually. Tell them how you analyze the reason behind the criticism and how you try to work on it. Admit that you are not perfect and tell the interviewer that criticism helps you learn and be a better person.

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Question - 17:

Please explain what motivates you to go on?

Ans:

We all know that money is one of the greatest motivators, we all want to be rich and that is the reason why we do a job. However, you are not supposed to say this, instead, talk about your dreams, talk about a role model who inspired you to take up nursing as a career. Your role model can be anybody, it can be one of your family members, your colleague or boss or it can be a famous personality.

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Question - 18:

Can you tell me something about your family?

Ans:

This question is asked in order to know the number of dependents you have. This question might seem to be a little too simple but it is an important question. Just be honest and tell them about the number of family members you have. Give them some details about the work each of your family members does also mention their educational qualifications. This question will help the interviewers understand your family background and will help them decide if you can relocate to another place if needed. It also helps the interviewers understand the remuneration that you are looking forward to.

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Question - 19:

Tell us how do you tackle stressful situations as Dialysis Therapist?

Ans:

Make sure that the answer to this question is positive, see to it that you stay calm while answering this question and you answer with confidence. Don't talk about instances when you got irritated during a stressful situation. Talk about the times where you managed the situation well. Provide all the facts that you can. You can answer by saying 'my superiors in my previous workplace, or college have told me that I manage stressful situations quite well. I stay calm during such situations and see to it the end goal is met. I am a good communicator and I communicate in a calm manner when faced with a stressful situation.

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Question - 20:

Tell us what Is Your Greatest Weakness as Dialysis Therapist?

Ans:

One approach to answering this question is to analyze the key skills and strengths required for the position you are interviewing for and then come up with an honest shortcoming which is not essential.

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Question - 21:

Explain me what Has Been The Greatest Disappointment In Your Life As A Nurse?

Ans:

If possible, tell about a personal disappointment i.e. the early death of a parent, child or school friend. Believe it or not, it is okay to have not had a "greatest" disappointment.

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Question - 22:

Tell me what, in your opinion, is the most important quality in a Dialysis Technician?

Ans:

Along with attention to detail, candidates should list empathy and compassion as the most important qualities in a Dialysis Technician. The ability to communicate effectively with a patient is essential, and this requires an understanding of a patient's emotional concerns.

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Question - 23:

Top Dialysis Therapist Job Interview Questions:

Ans:

- * Tell me about a time you discovered a safety hazard in your job. What did you do?
- * Recall a time when you had to take care of a difficult patient. How did you manage?
- * Have you ever received orders from nurse you didn't agree with? What did you do?



- * Describe a time when one of your patient's condition suddenly took a turn for the worse. What did you do? Where you emotionally involved?
- * Give me an example of a time you educated a patient in a health or safety matter

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Question - 24:

Basic Dialysis Therapist Job Interview Questions:

Ans:

- * Imagine that one of the patients is rude and uncooperative. How would you handle this?
- * If a PCT of the next shift called in sick when you're about to leave, what would you do?
- * What would you do differently when caring for different age groups?

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Question - 25:

Fresh Dialysis Therapist Job Interview Questions:

Ans:

- * How would you go about performing an EKG test?
- * What's your experience preparing patients for surgery?
- * Have you used any software as part of your job?
- * What's the biggest challenge you've faced in the past as PCT?
- * Are you trained in phlebotomy/dialysis?

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Question - 26:

General Dialysis Therapist Job Interview Questions:

Ans:

- * What are the vital signs?
- * How often should you monitor vital signs? How would you know if there's something wrong?
- * What tools and equipment should a PCT know how to use?
- * The PCT's work is often demanding. How do you stay motivated?

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Question - 27:

Tell us how do you ensure that patients remain calm throughout the dialysis treatment?

Ans:

Dialysis treatment can be a frightening experience for a patient, as it involves drawing lots of blood through complex operational technology. Candidates should ensure that patients are kept informed of every stage in the treatment process, ensuring that they understand what the treatment does and how it benefits them.

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Question - 28:

Explain me a situation that transpired during a dialysis session, which you handled flawlessly?

Ans:

A patient on whom a dialysis procedure was being performed, nearly slipped due to his blood pressure dropping. Before the heart could give out, I performed immediate CPR on him, saving his life and enabling him to finish the procedure.

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Question - 29:

Please explain what Do You Find Are The Most Difficult Decisions To Make In Nursing?

Ans:

Give concrete examples of difficult situations that actually happened at work. Then discuss what you did to solve the problem. Keep your answers positive (Even though it was difficult when Jane Doe quit without notice, we were able to rearrange the department workload to cover the position until a replacement was hired) and be specific. Itemize what you did and how you did it.

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Question - 30:

Explain me how do you ensure dialysis machines are in working order?

Ans:

Candidates should describe the steps they take to prevent any oversight in their duties. They should run through a checklist at the start of their day and ensure that all equipment is working, machines are calibrated to achieve optimal performance and dialysates are mixed according to a given formula, among other tasks.

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Question - 31:

Please explain what is your prime job at the beginning of your shift as a dialysis technician?

Ans:

At the beginning of my shift each day, I have to make sure that the dialysis equipment is in proper working order, attach dialyzers and tubing to machines, mix



dialysates according to the given formula and calibrate machinery to ensure optimum functionality.

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Question - 32:

Tell me how Much You Are Passionate About Nursing?

Ans:

Your response doesn't need to be work focused but do be sure that what you share isn't something that could potential cut in to your working hours.

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Question - 33:

Can you explain me Yourself As Organized As In Nursing Field?

Ans:

Absolutely. I like to have a check list and make sure that each item gets the attention it needs. Sometimes a little too much so. I make sure that everything is neat and in order. I am a very organized and thorough person, which I think contributes to my success as a nurse. I use several online and desktop tools to stay organized. I like to carefully plan my daily, weekly and long term work project. That helps me stay organized.

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Question - 34:

Can you explain about the time at work when you made an error that was critical?

Ans:

This question is quite tricky, you must be thinking that when in an interview you should only provide positive answers but what if the question wants you to talk about the negatives, here the question is asking about the mistake that you made during work and you cannot run away from the question. Answer this question by saying that you made a mistake and you learned from it. Talk about the mistake in detail and then add to it that you will not do the same mistake again as you have learned from it and you moved forward. Do not blame others for your mistake, own it and speak confidently. You don't have to mention a 'Critical' mistake you can speak of a minute mistake as well but be sure to talk about the positive consequences as well.

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Question - 35:

Tell us what are your greatest nursing strengths and weaknesses?

Ans:

This question is asked to understand the strengths you have that will match the strengths that the interviewers are looking for. Also when you mention your weaknesses it talks about your honesty. The employer wants to know if you are working on your weaknesses. When you talk about your weaknesses make sure to tell them how you are trying to work on it too. See to it that the answer you provide is positive. Talk about your strengths and weaknesses at a stretch. Prepare at least three strengths and three weaknesses.

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Question - 36:

Explain me can you work under pressure?

Ans:

This is a clinical question that is asked a lot during nursing interviews. You will have to be positive while answering such questions, tell them that you can work under pressure and that you know that the job will require you to work under pressure. If you are a fresher then, work pressure will help you grow in your career. Professionals don't fear pressure and they know how to deal with it. So, make sure that your answer to this question is positive in all ways possible.

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Question - 37:

Tell me why are you looking for a new job/ job?

Ans:

This is yet another common yet difficult interview question for nurse asked during interviews. If you are a fresher you don't have to ponder over the question a lot, just tell them that you are looking forward to work in the field you have always been interested in. However, if you are experienced and have worked previously in other hospitals then, you will have to be a little more cautious while answering this question. Don't just say that you are looking for better prospects, instead talk about the skills that will help you provide the employer with profits in the industry.

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Question - 38:

Explain me what if your shift ends at 4:00 pm, but your replacement doesn't arrive until 4:20 pm then, what do you do?

Ans:

This situation is quite common, we all have faced this situation in some way or the other. Remember that you can't talk negatively during the interview, try to stay positive throughout the interview. Give positive answers and make sure that you answer thoughtfully. Answer this nursing job interview question this way - 'people are late sometimes, but as a care provider my job doesn't end with my shift, I stay and continue to care for my patients until the replacement arrives.' Tell them that you would inform your superior that your replacement nurse hasn't arrived yet and that you will continue to care for the patients until the replacement nurse has arrived.

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Question - 39:

Can you explain how Would You Handle A Patient Who Complains About Everything?



Ans:

I would first be sure that the patient had no valid complaints and then just be patient and reassure them that we were doing our very best for them. I understand that some patients will complain about everything, just because they are unhappy about what brought them to our care. I just reassure them that everything possible is being done to make them comfortable.

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Question - 40:

Can you please explain what Are Your Pet Peeves?

Ans:

If something is bothering me, I step back, analyze "why" and find a good solution. If you asked my teenage daughter she would tell you my pet peeve is the volume of her music and the mess in her room.

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Question - 41:

Please tell me why is patient education so important in this regard?

Ans:

Dialysis is a painful and invasive procedure. If patients are not made aware of what to expect during and after each dialysis session, they may become hysterical or simply afraid to come to the next session. Educating them about how the procedure works and what to expect after a session is completed makes it easy for them to cope.

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Question - 42:

Tell us can you work during the weekends or late nights?

Ans:

Answer this question with a 'Yes' if you have no problems working overtime. All hospitals provide you with extra wage when you do over time. If you have some family obligations that stops you from doing over time, then tell the interviewer about it. Mostly if you put in more efforts then you earn points for promotion. So, take up the opportunities with a smile.

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Question - 43:

Tell us how is your relationship with your superiors?

Ans:

In order to answer this question, you will have to try to be as positive as possible. Do not begin to talk negatively about your seniors instead, talk about the good times and tell them how you bonded well with the seniors.

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Question - 44:

Explain me about the conflicts you had at work and also tell us how you resolved those conflict?

Ans:

Talk about the times you had conflicts with your superiors (Registered Nurse), your co-workers or with the patient. Talk about the situation in length and then talk about how you resolved the conflict. The employer wants to know if you have conflict resolution skills or not and if you can work as a part of a team. So think about the answer well before answering. You can easily slide down the path of talking negatively, but you must avoid it and try to stay positive throughout the interview. Make sure that you have at least three examples of the conflicts ready. Also, don't forget to mention what you learned from the experience.

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Question - 45:

Tell me what are your qualities that make you successful?

Ans:

If you feel that this question is difficult to answer, then simply think about the compliments you get from your superiors or co-workers. You sure must have got some compliments from others during work, quote those and speak about it. You can answer by saying 'I am good at communicating with the patients, I have got many compliments from my co-workers on how well I communicate with the patients. This ability helps me to deal with the stressful situations and thus helps me to be a successful nurse.'

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Question - 46:

Please explain why did you choose 'nursing' as your career?

Ans:

To answer this interview question you should look for motivation and values that have driven you to take up nursing as a career. See to it that you answer this question wisely. Do not talk about the monetary benefits that drive you to become a nurse. Even if money is an aspect that made you take up nursing, don't mention it. A good way to answer this question is, 'I always loved to help people, I feel good when I help people. I help people who are in need and this gives me the utmost satisfaction.'

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Question - 47:

Tell us what Would You Do If Your Replacement Did Not Arrive As A Nurse?



Ans:

- * I would wait until she arrived or until someone else was called in.
- * I would notify the supervisor and offer to stay until my replacement arrived.
- * Try calling her to see if she were on the way or if she needed help making arrangements for someone to take her shift.

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Question - 48:

Can you explain me your Work Style As A Nurse?

Ans:

- * I am very focused on my work and consequently, I am able to work quickly.
- * I keep a steady pace and check my work as I go along to prevent mistakes from snowballing.
- * Because I am very organized, I am able to accomplish a lot in a limited amount of time.
- * I am organized and efficient and I'm able to multi-task very well.

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Question - 49:

Please explain what Do People Most Often Criticize About You As A Nurse?

Ans:

There is no on-going criticism. I'm open to personal and professional growth and welcome the opportunity to improve. One of the things that I am sometimes criticized for is being too much of a perfectionist. I tend to expect very high standards of work from myself.

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Question - 50:

Please explain what type of skills do you need to work as a dialysis technician?

Ans:

Compassion is probably the first thing that patients look for when they are approached by a dialysis technician. Integrity and ability to keep patient information confidential is a close next. As far as job-related skills are concerned, it is important for dialysis technicians to be able to affix and remove dialyzers appropriately, calibrate dialysis machines, and document dialysis procedures according to set standards of practice.
