So, just take a deep breath, and start thinking through the math. (Yes, it's OK to ask for a pen and paper!)

# Ans:

Either preference is fine, but just remember you have to be able to explain why. If you choose money, you can also explain that is important to you as validation and you can highlight how money is important to you because of your goals (financial security, providing for your family, and so forth). Answering in terms of "I plan on continuing my studies in the technology field," when offered a question from a technology firm makes sense. Tailor answers about continued studies specific to desired job fields. Show interest in the industry and a desire to work long-term in said industry. Keep answers short and to the point, avoiding diatribes causing candidates to appear insincere.

# Ane:

Now is not the time to ask questions about holidays, pay or pensions - all these things can be asked later when you get an offer of employment. You will then give yourself one last chance to persuade the interviewer that you are the right candidate for the job.

Start by explaining what you'd need to do to get ramped up. What information would you need? What parts of the company would you need to familiarize yourself with? (e.g., "I think a great starter project would be diving into your email marketing campaigns and setting up a tracking system for them.") Sure, if you get the job, you (or your new employer) might decide there's a better starting place, but having an answer prepared will show the interviewer where you can add immediate impact-and that you're excited to get started.
