This doesn't have to be a direct connection; in fact, it's often more impressive when a candidate can make seemingly irrelevant experience seem very relevant to the role.

#### Question - 5:

Tell me a difficult situation you have overcome in the workplace?

#### Ans:

Conflict resolution, problem solving, communication and coping under pressure are transferable skills desired by many employers In Dairy Industry. Answering this question right can help you demonstrate all of these traits.

- \* Use real-life examples from your previous roles that you are comfortable explaining
- \* Choose an example that demonstrates the role you played in resolving the situation clearly
- \* Remain professional at all times you need to demonstrate that you can keep a cool head and know how to communicate with people

### Question - 6:

Tell me about a time you failed?

#### Ans:

Everyone has failed, so don't play dumb or claim you've never messed up In Dairy Industry. Think of a time when a work-related situation didn't turn out quite as you had hoped. An interviewer is interested in seeing how you took responsibility for your failure, what you learned from it, and how you would prevent similar failures from happening again.

During the workday, it is my duty to monitor workers to ensure that they are working according to the enforced safety policies and that any problems or accidents are quickly addressed. #### Question - 8:

What is your biggest weakness In Dairy Industry?

No one likes to answer this question because it requires a very delicate balance. You simply can't lie and say you don't have one; you can't trick the interviewer by offering up a personal weakness In Dairy Industry that is really a strength ("Sometimes, I work too much and don't maintain a work-life balance."); and you shouldn't be so honest that you throw yourself under the bus ("I'm not a morning person so I'm working on getting to the office on time.")

#### Question - 9:

What is your greatest professional achievement?

#### Ans:

Nothing says "hire me" better than a track record of achieving amazing results in past jobs In Dairy Industry, so don't be shy when answering this interview question! A great way to do so is by using the S-T-A-R method: Set up the situation and the task that you were required to complete to provide the interviewer with background context (e.g., "In my last job as a Dairy Industry, it was my role to manage the invoicing process"), but spend the bulk of your time describing what you actually did (the action) and what you achieved (the result). For example, "In one month, I streamlined the process, which saved my group 10 man-hours each month and reduced errors on invoices by 25%.'

- \* Do you know how to push back tactfully? \* Can you mediate conflicts?
- \* Can you deal with difficult personalities?

Do you ever take work home with you?

#### Ans:

Here are two great sample answers that might help get you started:

\* I am an extremely organized person, so I tend to be able to get my work done at work. However, if the need arose I would not be against taking work home. I do realize though that the work we do is important, and sometimes you have to do what needs to be done. \* I do not shy away from taking work home with me. I know that meeting deadlines and doing outstanding work sometimes means taking a bit of it home. I do not have a problem doing that when the need arises.

\* Make sure to give an honest answer. Lying about taking work home may turn out badly for you if it is required and you do not do it.

How do you handle conflicts with people you supervise?

Well, seriously, you might get asked brainteaser questions like these, especially in quantitative jobs. But remember that the interviewer doesn't necessarily want an exact number-he wants to make sure that you understand what's being asked of you, and that you can set into motion a systematic and logical way to respond. So, just take a deep breath, and start thinking through the math. (Yes, it's OK to ask for a pen and paper!)

The list of crucial character traits includes patience, tact, and poise, with personal and cultural sensitivity. One needs the ability to work long hours, with much walking and some physical tasks. But the most important trait of all is to love people and to have the desire to care for them.

#### Question - 18:

What have you done to reduce costs, increase revenue, or save time?

#### Ans:

Even if your only experience is an internship, you have likely created or streamlined a process that has contributed to the earning potential or efficiency of the practice. Choose at least one suitable example and explain how you got the idea, how you implemented the plan, and the benefits to the practice.

#### Question - 19:

What other companies are you interviewing with?

#### Ans:

Companies ask this for a number of reasons, from wanting to see what the competition is for you to sniffing out whether you're serious about the industry. "Often the best approach is to mention that you are exploring a number of other similar options in the company's industry,". It can be helpful to mention that a common characteristic of all the jobs you are applying to is the opportunity to apply some critical abilities and skills that you possess. For example, you might say 'I am applying for several positions with IT consulting firms where I can analyze client needs and translate them to development teams in order to find solutions to technology problems.'

What's a time you disagreed with a decision that was made at work?

#### Ans:

Everyone disagrees with the boss from time to time, but in asking this interview question In Dairy Industry, hiring managers want to know that you can do so in a productive, professional way. To close the deal on a job offer, you MUST be prepared with a concise summary of the top reasons to choose you. Even if your interviewer doesn't ask one of these question in so many words, you should have an answer prepared and be looking for ways to communicate your top reasons throughout the interview process. *View All Answers* 

#### Question - 23:

Do you think you have enough experience In Dairy Industry?

#### Ans:

If you do not have the experience they need, you need to show the employer that you have the skills, qualities and knowledge that will make you equal to people with experience but not necessary the skills. It is also good to add how quick you can pick up the routine of a new job role.

#### Question - 24:

Explain an occasion when you had to adapt in the face of a difficult situation?

#### Ans:

One of the most useful interview tactics is to remain positive about your work and achievements. This question lets the candidate draw on their own personal history to show how they have been positive and successful in the face of difficulties. Choose a specific occasion to describe, rather than dealing with generic platitudes.

#### Question - 25:

Explain me about a time when you reached a goal within a tight deadline?

#### Ans:

I work well under pressure to meet deadlines without jeopardizing the quality of my work. I have always worked in a fast pace environment where we are constantly under pressure to achieve best results within a time frame.

How would you motivate your team members to produce the best possible results?

#### Ans:

Trying to create competitive atmosphere, trying to motivate the team as a whole, organizing team building activities, building good relationships amongst people.

#### Question - 27:

What is your biggest achievement?

#### Ans:

Quality work to be is about doing work to the require or set standard, which is very important when it comes to warehouse operations.

#### Question - 28:

What is your greatest weakness In Dairy Industry? What are you doing to improve it?

#### Ans:

I believe my biggest weakness In Dairy Industry is wanting to help anyone I can help. What I mean is I am willing to take on task that are not my job. I want to learn all I can. However, that has helped me get promoted or even asked to help in times of need in other department. I have been know as the "go to person" when help is needed.

#### Question - 29:

What kind of salary do you need In Dairy Industry?

This is a loaded question and a nasty little game that you will probably lose if you answer first. So, do not answer it. Instead, say something like, that's a tough question. Can you tell me the range for this position? In most cases, the interviewer, taken off guard, will tell you. If not, say that it can depend on the details of the job. Then give a wide range.

If asked about plans for continued education, companies typically look for applicants to tie independent goals with the aims of the employer. Interviewers consistently want to see motivation to learn and improve. Continuing education shows such desires, especially when potentials display interests in academia potentially benefiting the company.

Answering in terms of "I plan on continuing my studies in the technology field," when offered a question from a technology firm makes sense. Tailor answers about continued studies specific to desired job fields. Show interest in the industry and a desire to work long-term in said industry. Keep answers short and to the point, avoiding diatribes causing candidates to appear insincere.

#### Question - 33:

Give an example of a time you successfully worked In Dairy Industry on a team?

#### Ans:

On the whole I prefer to stick to doing what I'm told rather than setting myself up to fail by doing things off my own bat. But there was this one time when I suggested to my boss at the pizza parlor that she try offering an 'all you can eat' deal to students to boost trade on Mondays. #### Question - 34:

What features of your previous jobs have you disliked?

#### Ans:

It's easy to talk about what you liked about your job in an interview, but you need to be careful when responding to questions about the downsides of your last position. When you're asked at a job interview about what you didn't like about your previous job, try not to be too negative. You don't want the interviewer to think that you'll speak negatively about this job or the company should you eventually decide to move on after they have hired you.

#### Question - 35:

What type of salary are you looking for?

#### Ans:

This can be a very tricky question as the individual asking it is probably digging for something other than a simple answer to the question. We recommend that you don't immediately respond to the question directly. Instead, say something like, "That a difficult question. What is range for this position?" More often than not the interviewer will tell you. If the interviewer insists on direct answer you may want say that it depends on the details of the job - then give a wide salary range.

What can you offer us that someone else can not?

#### Ans:

Bad Answer: Going negative - if the candidate starts trash talking other candidates, it's a sure sign of a bad attitude. Also, if they can't provide a solid answer, it may show that they lack thorough knowledge of the skills the job requires, and an understanding of where they fit in.

Good answer: The candidate can name specific skills, abilities or understandings they have that apply directly to the job that other candidates are unlikely to have, or are in short supply.

#### Question - 37:

What is your desired salary In Dairy Industry?

#### Ans:

Bad Answer: Candidates who are unable to answer the question, or give an answer that is far above market. Shows that they have not done research on the market rate, or have unreasonable expectations.

Good answer: A number or range that falls within the market rate and matches their level of mastery of skills required to do the job.

#### Question - 38:

If the company you worked for was doing something unethical or illegal, what would you do?

#### Ans:

Report it to the leaders within the company. True leaders understand business ethics are important to the company's longevity *View All Answers* 

#### Question - 39:

If you felt like you were hitting the proverbial "wall" and getting burned out, what would you do to re-energize yourself?



#### Ans:

Take a break to rest. Work in smaller increments of time to increase focus with breaks in between. Delegate tasks to those that are willing to help. *View All Answers* 

#### Question - 40:

Tell me about a problem that you've solved in a unique or unusual way. What was the outcome? Were you happy or satisfied with it?

#### Ans:

In this question the interviewer is basically looking for a real life example of how you used creativity to solve a problem.

#### Question - 41:

What is your biggest fear?

#### Ans:

Don't try to sugarcoat the answer by listing something ambitious as a fear, unless you truly mean it (for example: I fear being a great leader) - Share your real fears but discuss how you would overcome them.

Why do you want to work in this industry In Dairy Industry?

#### Ans:

Make sure you research the industry first. Then find at least 3 core things about that industry that you're passionate about (for example: how their solutions impact clients, their culture, the leadership, etc)

What is the most important lesson / skill you've learned from school?

#### Ans:

Think of lessons learned in extra curricular activities, in clubs, in classes that had a profound impact on your personal development. For example, I had to lead a team of 5 people on a school project and learned to get people with drastically different personalities to work together as a team to achieve our objective.

#### Question - 44:

How would you impact the company?

#### Ans:

Consider first the role that you're applying for and then think of 3 ways where you could potentially impact the company's bottom line and top line. Then consider how you impact the company in a creative manner (how do you help productivity, the development of new products, marketing etc - of course this part is specific to the role you're applying for)

#### Question - 45:

How has school prepared you for this job role?

#### Ans:

Think back to how you've interacted with your peers to develop social skills, how you've worked with classmates on projects to develop teamwork and collaborative skills, how you've developed discipline through studying, how the courses have helped your creativity, and how the classes you've taken have impacted your analytical / problem solving / reasoning skills.

#### Question - 46:

What are your thoughts on failure?

#### Ans:

Failure happens. It's a part of life. The key is understanding that you can't be perfect at everything and more importantly you're going to learn from failures to come out stronger.

What are your presentation skills like In Dairy Industry?

#### Ans:

Make sure you share a story that demonstrates your presentation skills in front of many people. If you are really brave, offer to give a snippet of that presentation to the interviewer. This will definitely be different from what most people do.

#### How articulate are you in expressing your ideas?

#### Ans:

One of the best ways to answer this question is clearly articulate three points that demonstrate how articulate you are (and in a sense show that in a live setting) - for example: "I would say I'm articulate because one, I typically gather my thoughts before speaking, two, I organize my thoughts well, and three I'm concise when making a point.

#### Question - 49:

How do you act when you encounter competition?

#### Ans:

This question is designed to see if you can rise the occasion. You want to discuss how you are the type to battle competition strongly and then you need to cite an example if possible of your past work experience where you were able to do so.

How good are you at problem solving?

#### Ans:

Describe the problem first and then discuss how you were able to fix it. *View All Answers* 

#### Question - 51:

What general trends do you see in our industry?

#### Ans:

Examine what's happened in the industry in the last 5 - 10 years and how it's evolved and then look at what both the company and analysts are saying about the future of that industry in which that company competes in. Read trade magazines / online sources in that industry as well to make sure you stay up to date on trends.

#### Question - 52:

Why should we give you this job In Dairy Industry when someone else is equally qualified?

#### Ans:

Describe how you're unique, but make sure you tie it to the job responsibilities and how you would impact the company. For example, "I believe my unique programming skills and experience in developing over 18 best selling iphone apps will help the company develop high quality applications faster than my competitors"

#### Question - 53:

What do you expect to be earning in 5 years In Dairy Industry?

#### Ans:

Discuss how you expect yourself to be excellent at your job. Thus, it would be reasonable to expect pay that is based on the merit of your work. View All Answers

#### Question - 54:

What would you do if our competitor offered you a position In Dairy Industry?

#### Ans:

I would weigh the offer and consider it, however, this company and this role is my first choice. *View All Answers* 

#### Question - 55:

What negative thing would your last boss say about you?

#### Ans:

"He/She wouldn't say anything bad, but he/she may point out I could improve in a certain area, and I've taken steps to become better at those skills" *View All Answers* 

#### Question - 56:

If you were interviewing someone for this position In Dairy Industry, what traits would you look for?

#### Ans:

This is where the interviewer tries to turn the tables on you. Answer confidently by stating 3 specific traits that are applicable to that job role. For example, a consulting job would likely look for someone who can think outside of the box. After answering, ask them, "Am I spot on here and if not, what traits would you look for?"

#### Question - 57:



#### What is your greatest fear?

#### Ans:

We all have fears. It's okay to discuss them. Just don't dive too deeply into them. Discuss how you would work to overcome your fears. You don't want to seem weak. You want to acknowledge it's out there but that you'll be able to work through it.

#### Question - 58:

Tell me the difference between good and exceptional?

#### Ans:

Good gets the job done on time and is high quality. Exceptional is a game changer - it stands out, it's creative, it's above and beyond expectations. Tell the interviewer a story about how you were exceptional.

#### Question - 59:

There's no right or wrong answer, but if you could be anywhere in the world right now, where would you be?

#### Ans:

Just be honest about where you'd like to be - you never know - you may end up bonding with the interviewer with the location. However, you want to stress that you want to work out of the location that you're interviewing for.

#### Question - 60:

What do you see yourself doing within the first 30 days of this job?

#### Ans:

Typically the first 30 days are designed for you to learn as much as possible In Dairy Industry. Work hard to get to know your teammates, how they work together, and how you can make the biggest impact.

#### Ans:

What makes you a good manager?

#### Ans:

Describe how you manage people, time, money and energy in the most effective manner to achieve the best return of that investment. View All Answers



#### Question - 66:

What specific steps do you utilize in solving workplace problems?

#### Ans:

Analyze the problem In Dairy Industry. Discuss possible remedies and resulting outcomes. Decide on the remedy and track results. Re-visit problem if it's not resolved.

#### Ans:

Ideally, you want to take on the role you're interviewing for, but you want to be flexible with your responsibilities In Dairy Industry if there are any changes. View All Answers

#### Question - 69:

When was the last time something upset you at work? What did you do?

#### Ans:

Almost everyone has an emotional moment related to work at some point - you're not alone. The key is to learn why you reacted that way and to focus not on the problem but HOW to resolve it. Another key component is to be aware of your emotional response so that you can learn to control it in the future in a calm way. View All Answers

#### Question - 70:

Tell me about the last time you had to work with someone inside or outside of your department to accomplish a goal?

#### Ans:

Show that you were communicative with that person and that you were able to collaborate effectively in sharing ideas and work tasks. They want to see that you can be a team player.
